Free training offered for early childhood educators

ting nearly \$9 million for training and professional development grants for the ear-ly learning and child care sector. This is part of Saskatchewan's commitment to improve quality in the early years and child care sector, and is just one of many programs delivered through the Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement.

The province has partnered with Collège Mathieu, Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT) and Saskatchewan Polytechnic (Sask Polytech) to make Early Childhood Education (ECE) training opportunities available at no charge. The three post-secondary institutions have programming available beginning in 2022-23. "Early Childhood Educators

have a positive impact on the learning and development of Saskatchewan's youngest learners," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said. "That's why we are working with post-secondary institutions to deliver training opportunities for ECEs and those who want to work in early learning and

"There is no child care system without an Early Learning and Child Care workforce," Canada's Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, Karina Gould, said. "Early Childhood Edu-cators do incredible work in nurturing our children, and these training and professional development opportu-nities are meaningful to ensure they have access to the tools and resources they need

to succeed."

Early childhood educators, regulated child care home providers and child care home assistants will be prior-itized for enrolment and other participants wanting to become ECEs or to open their own family child care home are also welcome to enroll. Much of the training is online so that it can be taken on evenings and weekends, at the student's pace and when it is most convenient for them.

The training and professional development opportunities range from ECE certificate courses and diploma training to more specialized training such as an Autism Certificate of Achievement, a Francophone course for ECEs to support children with Autism, and Truth and Reconciliation workshops.

"This collaboration be-tween the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education and Collège Mathieu will allow us to continue to promote better access to flexible training and an en-hancement of the Early Childhood Education program of-fered by our institution, to increase a Francophone work-force and support sufficient staffing in early childhood centres," Chief Executive Officer of Collège Mathieu, Francis Kasongo said. "It will also contribute to the professional development of any person considering a career in Early

Childhood Education."
"Our commitment to providing accessible training options for Early Childhood Educators that are culturally responsive, grounded in Indigenous pedagogy and traditional practice, and based on community and indus-try need, remains steadfast," President and CEO of the Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies, Riel Bellegarde said. "SIIT is excited to continue developing and delivering various professional develop-ment and Early Childhood Education Level I, II and III certification programssionals across Saskatchewan."

"We are deeply grateful to the Government of Saskatchewan for investing in the institution's early childhood education programs. Saskatchewan Polytechnic

Facilities can visit saskatchewan.ca or contact their Early Learning and Child Care Consultant for more information on available grant funding.

Providing grants for Early Childhood Educators is just one part of a larger initiative by the Governments of Canada and Saskatchewan to implement a Canada-wide Ear ly Learning and Child Care System. The Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Ear-ly Learning and Child Care Agreement, signed a year ago, provides a federal investment of nearly \$1.1 billion over five years for regulated early learning and child care programs and services for chil-dren under the age of six in Saskatchewan. With 70 per cent child care fee reductions already announced in the province, the goal is to bring down average fees for regulated child care to \$10-a-day by

Revenue creates budget surplus

A strong economy and higher resource prices have significantly improved the province's finances.

"That means we can bal-ance the budget, pay down debt and help Saskatchewan residents with the rising cost of living," Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Donna Harpauer said August 23 as she released the first quarter financial update. At first quarter, Saskatche-

wan is forecasting a surplus of \$1.04 billion for 2022-23, a \$1.51 billion improvement from budget, largely due to higher revenue from non-re-

newable resources. Harpauer announced a four point affordability plan, using higher revenue from the resources owned by the people of Saskatchewan to help people address rising costs due to inflation and to reduce the province's debt.

"Strong resource prices have meant higher provin-cial revenues, and that's good news, but it also means the cost of almost everything you buy has gone up," Harpauer said. "That's why our gov-ernment is using those higher revenues to help Saskatch-ewan people with the rising
